THEME - THIS VERY BRITISH WAY OF LIFE

- Class 1** **Stately Home** – An exhibit. Floor Space allowed 122cm x 122cm on individual sites. Height optional. Number of placements at the discretion of the exhibitor. Background will be blue. This exhibit may be completed by a single exhibitor or two persons. . The Joy Davenport Memorial Cup will be presented to the winner/s of this class.
- Class 2** **Skills and Crafts** – an exhibit. Space allowed 90cms wide x 60cms deep. Height optional. The Brenda Scammell Bronze tazza will be awarded to the winner of this class.
- Class 3** **Aspects of the Coast** – an exhibit. Space allowed 90cms wide x 60cms deep. Height optional.
- Class 4** **Our love of China and Earthenware** – an exhibit. To depict a well known pattern of china or earthenware – or an individual potter. Space allowed 90cms wide x 60cms deep. Height optional. Please provide a title if you feel that one is necessary. The Lewis Cup will be awarded to the winner of this class.
- Class 5** **This Green and Pleasant Land** – an exhibit with the emphasis on foliage. Space allowed 90cms wide x 60cms deep. Height optional. The William Gamble crystal bowl will be awarded to the winner of this class.
- Class 6** **Colours in the flame.** An exhibit on a candlestick. Space allowed 60cms wide x 60cms deep. Height optional. This exhibit may be completed at home prior to staging.
- Class 7** **The Tales of Beatrix Potter** – A petite exhibit. Not to exceed 25csm in any direction. This exhibit may be completed at home prior to staging.
- Class 8** **A Summer Pomander for a bridesmaid at a country wedding.** This can be of fresh or dried/preserved plant material. Can be held by a stick or a ribbon. A hook will be provided to hang your exhibit. Maximum length 60cms. This exhibit may be completed at home prior to staging.

RULES AND INFORMATION FOR THE FLORAL ART SECTION

Judging will be undertaken by a fully accredited NAFAS Judge in accordance with the Competitor's Manual 1st Edition 2001 which is available from the National Secretary, NAFAS, Osborne house, 12 Devonshire Square, London EC2M 4TE. A copy will be available in the Floral Art Section on staging day.

Exhibits may be staged on the Saturday of Show weekend from 12.00 noon to 9.00pm and also on Show Day (Sunday) from 6.00am to 7.00am.

All exhibits to be competitor's own work, arranged in the marquee without assistance with the exception of Classes 6, 7 and 8, which may be prepared at home.

The judge's decision is final.

Exhibitors are requested wherever possible not to use as accessories any article of value as the Derbyshire Agricultural & Horticultural Society or its officers accept no responsibility for loss or damage however caused.

Prize money will be sent to exhibitors by cheque in the week following the show.

Exhibits not to be dismantled before 4.30pm on Show Day. Exhibitors cards, passes etc needed for Show Day will be given to you on staging day.

Draping will be blue in colour as in 2009. A sample can be made available for new arrangers.

Closing date for entries will be 1st June 2010. Late entries accepted in exceptional circumstances.
